

Every year hundreds of ghost nets drift from the Arafura Sea onto Cape York's western beaches, entangling marine life such as turtles as they go.

Many of the turtles that do make it to the beaches of Cape York to lay their eggs have their nests raided by feral pigs.

Chivaree Turtle Conservation Camp is all about the indigenous people of the region working to save the dwindling turtle population. And this is your opportunity to help.
