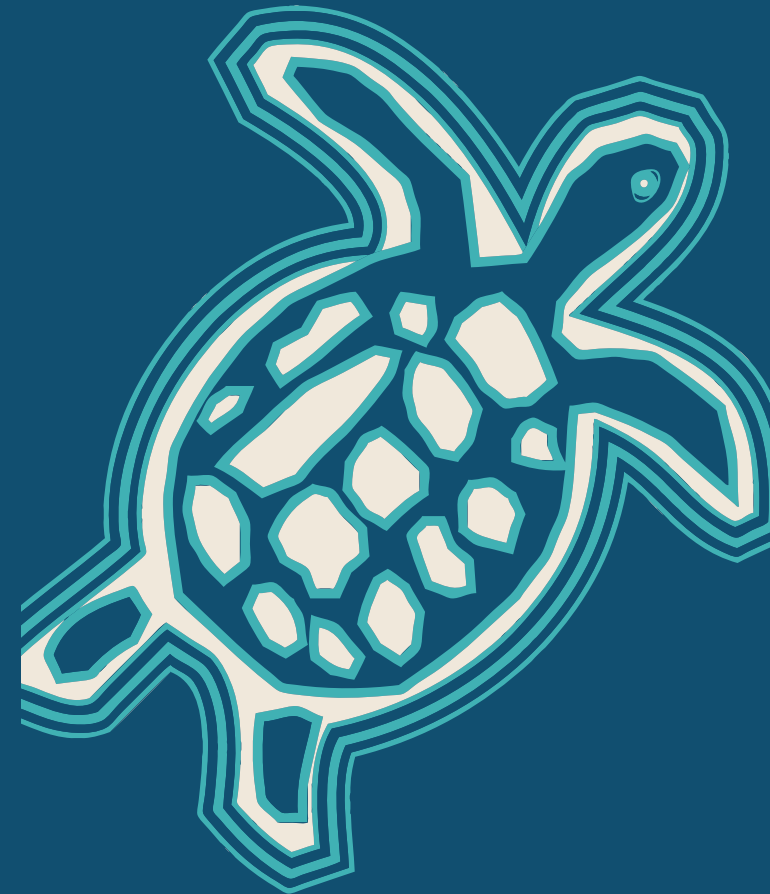

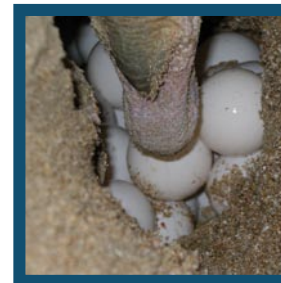

HELP US SAVE THE BABIES

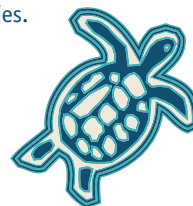
Every year hundreds of ghost nets drift from the Arafura Sea onto Cape York's western beaches, entangling marine life such as turtles as they go.

Many of the turtles that do make it to the beaches of Cape York to lay their eggs have their nests raided by feral pigs.

Chivaree Turtle Conservation Camp is all about the indigenous people of the region working to save the dwindling turtle population. And this is your opportunity to help.



The Chivaree campsite is at Janie Creek, 14kms south of the Aboriginal community of Mapoon, about 80 kms north of Weipa. Accommodation is in quality tent-cabins on raised platforms with modern bush camping facilities.



During the camp you'll work alongside local Aboriginal Rangers and Wildlife Officers as they tag and measure nesting turtles, protect freshly laid eggs with feral pig exclusion devices, remove ghost nets from the beach and collect valuable data for Queensland's Marine Turtle Conservation Project.

Inclusions:

- Return transport from Weipa Airport to Chivaree Bush Camp.
- 5 nights at Chivaree Bush Camp.
- 3 meals per day and light snacks.
- The experience of working and interacting with Aboriginal people on their own land and learn about life in a remote Aboriginal Community.
- The satisfaction of knowing that you are helping to save Cape York's nesting turtle population.
